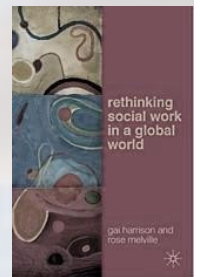

Ross Daniels

Ross Daniels is all about integrating technology into our social work practice and will have us all laughing in the aisles while he drags us into the 21st Century. Within the Bachelor of Human Services Ross is responsible for units dealing with the political economy and legal context of human services. Ross has had considerable involvement in social welfare issues in Queensland working as a social worker for 12 years before commencing employment at QUT. He has served on the Boards of a number of welfare organisations. Ross has been involved in regional and international human rights issues and served as the International Chairperson of Amnesty International for four years. He is currently a member of Queensland Executive Amnesty International; Vice-President Queensland Australians for Native Title and Reconciliation; member Iraq Solidarity Group; member Palestinian Solidarity Group, Convenor of Electronic Activism; Advisor to Human Rights and Peace Society Nepal.

Lesley Chenoweth

Lesley Chenoweth BSocWk, MSocWk, PhD is the foundation Professor of Social Work at Griffith University in Queensland, Australia. She has more than thirty years experience as a social work practitioner and academic, twenty of these in the disability area. Her current research interests span disability issues, human services and rural communities and welfare reform. Lesley has conducted research on disability policy analysis, deinstitutionalisation, families, violence and abuse and delivering human services to people in rural communities. She is a regular consultant to government and community organisations and has served on numerous boards and committees for disability, legal and family welfare agencies. Lesley is a regular invited speaker at conferences both in Australia and overseas.

Lesley has recently returned from the Coping and Resilience Conference in Dubrovnik, and brings to you this evening 3 interesting case studies on this year's Social Work Day theme of "Making Human Rights Real: the social work agenda".

Rose Melville

Rose Melville is Senior Lecturer at the Social Policy Unit and Honours Coordinator of the Bachelor of Social Work course at the School of Social Work and Human Services, University of Queensland, Australia. She has published widely in national and international journals on teaching, social policy and non-profit organizations.

If we are to fully understand the impact of local concerns on social work, we have to consider these in a global context. The soon to be launched book "*Rethinking Social Work in a Global World*" provides the key to better understanding. It critically examines the relationship between the global and the local in light of a range of social issues and shows how such analysis can assist in improving social work practice. Incorporating the views of practitioners and analysing students perceptions of global issues, the authors:

- draw on a range of theoretical disciplines and traditions, including post-colonialism, sociology, cultural studies and political science
- explore contemporary global issues such as the environment, new information and communications technology and the global mental health movement;
- examine the implications of adopting global notions of citizenship for social work, in a postcolonial era; and
- provide discussion points to ground the above ideas in a local context, to better inform everyday practice.

Rose will speak about some of the core ideas from the texts.
