National Disability Services (NDS) is organising a free information session exclusively for allied health professionals and allied health practice managers in the ACT to introduce the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS). The session will look at the NDIS both from a clinical and a business perspective and will be preceded by a networking opportunity starting at 6:00pm to meet others with an interest in working under NDIS.

The information session is aimed at allied health professionals and service providers from across all relevant disciplines that have not yet or just recently engaged with the NDIS. It will feature presentations from the NDIA and a panel of practitioners from a range of professions and type of organisations to share their experience and answer your questions.

Background

The Disability Workforce Innovation Network (WIN) project managed by NDS was set up to support the sector to collaborate on solutions to workforce issues arising from the roll-out of the NDIS. Allied health was identified at an early stage as an area facing significant workforce issues in the ACT. It is evident that the ACT needs more allied health professionals providing services to people with disabilities to match the growing demand under the NDIS. The Disability WIN project has involved a group of allied health representatives to organise this session with the aim to inform allied health professionals on the opportunities offered through the roll-out of the NDIS.
